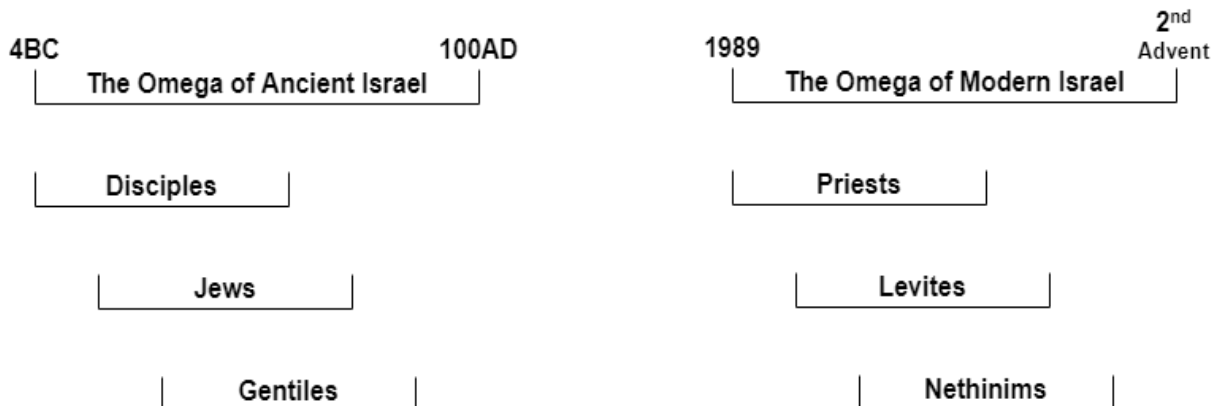
### Review

The Omega of both Ancient and Modern Israel can be compared and contrasted. **They are histories of success.** This means that **the Omega of Ancient Israel most closely resembles the Omega of Modern Israel.**

The Omega of Ancient Israel is a history that began in 4BC, and ended in 100AD. Within this history, there are 3 Fractals — The Disciples, The Jews, and The Gentiles.

The Omega of Modern Israel is a History that began in 1989, and ends at The 2<sup>nd</sup> Advent. Within this history, there are 3 Fractals — The Priests, The Levites, and The Nethinims.



### What makes a History of Success?

When the work of gathering a people begins, human beings are raised up by God to do this work. These human beings are messengers. They teach people about what God needs them to learn.

When this work begins, God raises up a 1<sup>st</sup> messenger. This messenger is used by God to do this work. However the 1<sup>st</sup> messenger has misconception, and because of this, they make mistakes. A 2<sup>nd</sup> messenger is then raised up, and one of their functions, is to correct the mistake of the 1<sup>st</sup> messenger. **If the work of correcting the mistakes of the 1<sup>st</sup> messenger is done, then a history is successful.**
